



A popular shared path along the old rail track, through dense bushland and coastal scrub, past suburban gardens, through a brick-lined tunnel under the Pacific Highway and across a boardwalk over the coastal wetlands.

16km each way, gentle slopes, easy riding on a shared path with controlled road crossings, requires a basic level of fitness. 6km from Honeysuckle to track start, flat, minor roads for experienced cyclists

Fernleigh Track is a popular shared path from Adamstown to Belmont, with entry/exit points at Whitebridge, Gateshead, Jewells and Redhead. Features along the way include the 180m curved brick-lined tunnel under the Pacific Highway, the restored station platform at Redhead, and the boardwalk across wetlands in the Redhead to Belmont section.
